Activity Overview

Fishing School: Permit for teaching people how to fish. A designated regional manager may issue a permit for the operation of a fishing school on waters in the region to either a person who is associated with a recognized educational institution or a person who derives their income from work related to angling.

Ensure that you meet the eligibility requirements prior to applying.

Requirement Type	Requirement Detail
Age	Applicant must be at least 19 years old unless a parent or guardian has given written consent to the application.
Wildlife	Must be wildlife under the Wildlife Act.

The following information is required as part of the application process. The requirements for the mandatory authorization(s) are included.
